WE welcomed both the attending businesses and non-profits to call on his expertise to provide technical assistance. his services include business retention and growth, business coaching and educational outreach. All services are confidential and free. • <u>CED License Update:</u> CED (Community Entertainment District) - We have four price reduced liquor licenses in our district. All four have been applied for. To date Molly Wellman's group, Myrtle's, passed final inspection and have received notification of their license. Both New Orleans to Go and The Growler House have applied. They have signed leases for space on Madison Rd. in DeSales Plaza. Their permits are in the process. Herbert Hood has applied for the 4th permit. Still in process. • <u>DCDC and WHRF Update:</u> WHRF closed on both the "Bank" building and the "French" building. Bloomfield Schon Architect & Engineer purchased the "French" building. They intend to lease a portion of the first floor to someone in the food industry. DCDC continues to pay off the WHRF and Social Media contract debt. Hope to have fundraising event later this fall. DCDC and WHRF would like to go back to counsel to request additional TIF money for continued development of the business district including purchase and stabilizing buildings. 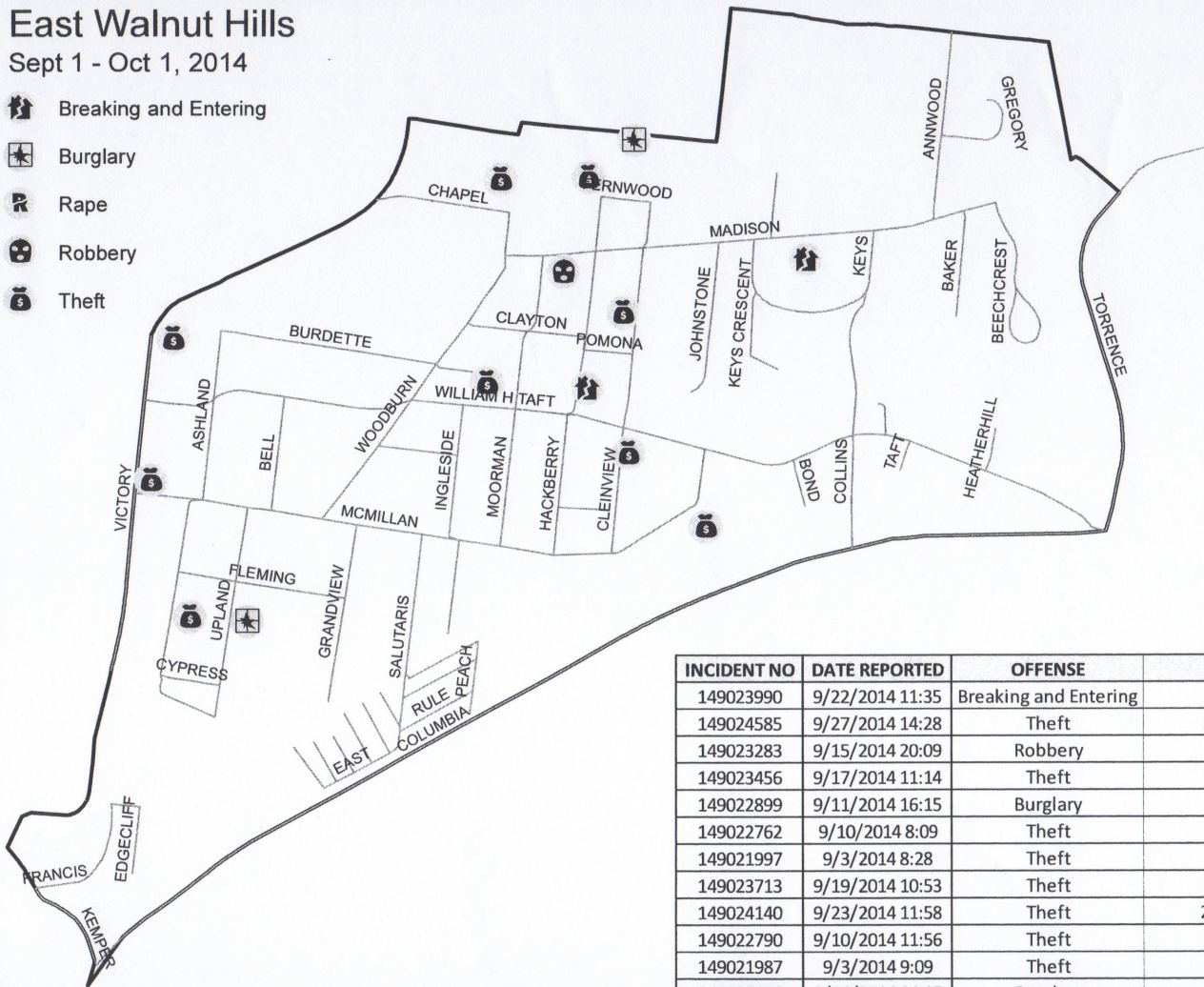
