Fire Captain George Hornback reported that 3 fire companies are located in the EWH firehouse, and that one paramedic is on duty at all times. April stats included 278 runs: 231 EMS, 13 fires and 34 non-fires. He also reported that EWH had 6 brownout days in April, but that these occurrences will lessen as new firefighters are being added, thanks to government grants. June 20 there will be a "safety fair" at Kroger's.
