



## Council on Aging event will connect Hamilton County older adults and caregivers to important resources

Individuals must register for this free event by April 5

**BLUE ASH, OHIO, March 29, 2024** – Council on Aging (COA) is partnering with the Public Library of Cincinnati and Hamilton County and other Hamilton County agencies to connect area older adults and caregivers to important information, resources and benefits than can help improve their quality of life.

More than 132,000 Hamilton County residents are age 65 or older – with 30% living in the City of Cincinnati. Nearly one-third have at least one disability. Called Aging Connections, this event features experts from COA, Pro Seniors, the Hamilton County Prosecutor's Office, Hamilton County Emergency Management Agency, Cincinnati Recreation Commission and the Center for Closing the Health Gap.

<u>The event is free, but registration is required by April 5.</u> Event attendees can expect an information-filled day including:

- Council on Aging staff can provide information about programs and resources to age in place, caregiver support, free health and wellness programs, utility assistance and more.
- <u>Hamilton County Emergency Management</u> will share why it's especially important for older adults to be prepared in an emergency – and ways to do it.
- Representatives from <u>Cincinnati Recreation Commission</u> will be on hand to discuss when and where you can enjoy CRC events designed for older adults.
- Representatives from the <u>Center for Closing the Health Gap</u> will share knowledge that may help older adults when dealing with health challenges no matter the color of their skin.
- Experts from <u>Pro Seniors</u> and the <u>Hamilton County Prosecutor's Office</u> will share information about common frauds and scams targeting older adults and what you need to know to NOT become a victim.


