Welcome	Following the recess of the Annual Meeting, President Freeman Durham called the Monthly meeting to order at 7:14 p.m. Approximately 32 people attended the meeting.	None
1. Cincinnati Police Report	Officer Perry Locke discussed the crime statistics for April 2022 (posted on the website prior to the meeting and attached). He requested that attendees look out for their neighbors as the weather warms. He cautioned to look out for identity scams; there are a lot out there. He recommended calling the police if you are unsure if something is a scam - whether if it is by phone or otherwise. District 2 has increased traffic monitoring in EWH. If there is a problem area that you want monitored, contact him. The police will begin to increase focus on motorcycle enforcement as well.	None
2. Bush Recreation Center Report	Vanessa Henderson was not present. Contact Ms. Henderson for further information (vanessa.henderson@cincinnati-oh.gov).	None
3. Approval of Monthly Meeting Minutes	There being no revisions to the April 6, 2022 monthly Assembly Minutes (posted on the website prior to the meeting), the Minutes were deemed approved as posted.	None
4. Treasurer's Report	Freeman reported on the March Treasurer's Report that had been posted online prior to the meeting (see attached Report). Freeman reported that there was \$8900 in income, mostly related to parking lot revenues. There was \$10,800 in expenses, also mostly related to the parking lots. There was a deficit for the month of \$1900. There was approximately \$52,000 on hand at the end of March.	None
5. Events Committee Report.	Christine Johnson reported. (1) The annual Clay Alliance Pottery Fair will take place 10:00 am-4:00 pm Saturday May 7 in the Madison parking lot. (2) The Monthly Trash Walk on May 7 will start at 9:00 am at the Evanston Rec Center. (3) EWHA, with the Evanston Community Council, will co-host a music in the parks series starting in June. 6. Infrastructure Committee & Farmer's Market	Deb Dereshkevich reported. (1) Infrastructure - The Committee continues to work on street and traffic safety issues. Volunteers have stepped up. (2) Farmers Market – Deb said that the Market is now planning to start the 2 nd Friday in July. Volunteers are needed and the July start date will allow people who currently are in school to volunteer. The market organizers are looking for a bread and flower vendor among other vendors.	None
7. Parking Committee Report	Rick Boydston reported. There are two parking lots managed by EWHA: the Woodburn lot and the Madison lot. There are fifty-four 24/7 monthly parkers – the highest number ever. Monthly hourly fees are over \$5000 after fees are paid. The Committee continues to negotiate with the City over a new lease for the Madison lot. There is a possibility of installing charging stations in the lot(s) at some point. The Committee is continuing to consider the possibility of payment only by app and eliminating the payment kiosks. The EWHA Board put in an application for a City grant to fund upgrades to the Woodburn lot. Monthly meetings of the Committee take place in the building where Hey Day is and take place right before the Assembly meeting. Everyone is invited to attend.	None
8. Business Association Report.	Sara Siefring reported. Walk on Woodburn is May 13. Seven members from the Seven Hills Symphony will be playing from 7-9:00 pm. Meetings take place on the last Monday at noon. All are welcome to attend.	None
9. Development Committee Report	Drew Gores reported. (1) Woodburn Properties (the 7 properties on the east side of Woodburn, north of De Sales Ln., and south of MRC) - EWHA has looked to save and redevelop the properties over the years with no success. The current owner of the Woodburn Properties is being sued by City for unsafe properties/nuisance abatement. A developer from Indianapolis is interested in buying the properties. That developer would demolish the existing houses and	None

	build new townhouses (perhaps 27). The Indianapolis developer has not	
	purchased the properties. The developer has appeared in front of the	
	Development Committee and will be returning with a revised plan in May to	
	address the issues raised by the Committee members. Variances will be needed	
	ant the developer will likely be asked to appear at a monthly Assembly meeting.	
	(2) The City's Planning Department held a Community Engagement Zoom	
	meeting April 24 via Zoom to discuss funding the 2-way street conversion	
	project on McMillan, Taft and Woodburn around the new Woodburn Exchange	
	development. The bids have come in at \$150,000 above budget due to increased	
	construction costs and it is proposed to used the EWH TIF funds to pay for the	
	\$150,000. Drew explained that TIF stands for Tax Increment Financing: in the	
	designated EWH TIF district a portion of additional property taxes collected	
	above a base property tax amount are placed in the EWH TIF fund to support	
	projects in the neighborhood. Currently, there is even \$1 million in Co. 1	
	projects in the neighborhood. Currently, there is over \$1 million in Cash	
	Available funds from which the \$150,000 could be paid. At the Community	
	Engagement meeting, there were almost no comments about the funding – no	
	one voiced any opposition; there were a number of questions about the design of	
	the two-way project at the meeting. The construction of two-way street	
	conversion project is underway. The City wants to complete the street conversion	
	by August, before St Ursula students return to school, so that the school can	
	prepare students for the change in traffic patterns. The entire project, including	
	the upgrades to the sidewalk streetscape along Woodburn and Taft, will be	
	finished in October 2022. (3) Woodburn Exchange - There is a EWHA Board	
	committee, made up of EWH business owners, BA members, EWHA Board	
	members and the developers, which is meeting to advise the Woodburn	
	Exchange developers on potential tenants for the 10,000 sq ft of commercial	
	space. There will likely be 5, 6 tenants. (4) Symposium, in the former Cafe De	
	Sales space, is scheduled to open May 5th. Hey Day opened in April and sells	
	burgers, hot dogs, chicken and fries. It will be open most days from 4:00 pm on.	
	Solstice is going into the former Suzie Wongs space.	
10. Owls Nest Park	Ben Strohm reported that he had attended a Park Board meeting a week ago.	None
Update.	where the posts that were recently installed were discussed. Park Department	
	representatives and members of the Owls Nest Advisory group will be walking	
	the park next Thursday to discuss the posts: can the posts be "beautified" or will	
	they be removed and replaced with other elements to deter cars entering the	
	park? Money to pay for this is an issue. A Request for Proposal (RFP) has been	
	issued by the Park Department to determine the design scope for the renovation	
	of the pavilion. A consultant is to be hired to work with the communities.	
11. Misc.	Jens, who owns the house across from St Margaret's Hall, reported that there had	
	been a recent car accident where a car going over 100 miles per hour hit a brick	
	wall, a parked SUV, knocked over a utility pole and ended up in the big pottery	
	pots in front of his house. The car caught on fire and the fire department	
	responded quickly. He was wondering about special safety measures that could	
	be taken to calm traffic. This is the third accident at the same spot since he	
	moved in. Jens said that he was told that speed bumps can't be installed due to	
	impeding safety vehicle access. Florence Parker from OKI Regional Council	
	reported that there are "speed cushions" that safety vehicles can go over and	
	suggested looking into them. Other comments in the Chat: reduce traffic to one	
	lane each way and use digital speed signs.
