Cincinnati Fire Department Report	Fire Chief Michael Washington introduced himself to the attendees. He became the fire chief six months ago. He reported that there are 26 fire stations and 40 fire companies focused on emergency response and risk reduction. He reported that the fire department is focused on the following: (1) reducing falls by seniors, (2) reducing drownings, (3) firearm safety, and (4) child car seat inspections. October 6-13 is fire prevention week. He reminded everyone to check the batteries in the their smoke detectors. The fire department will assist residents in acquiring a smoke detector. 2. Cincinnati Police Report	Officer Kevin Butler discussed the crime statistics for September (posted on the website prior to the meeting and attached). The current statistics are well below the 5-year average and are within the acceptable range. National Night out took place at Owls Nest Park on October 5. There was a great turnout. Officer Butler talked about the process to deal with abandoned cars. The impoundment lot has limited space which can slow down the process; however, cars are being towed currently. During the height of COVID, the police department ceased issuing tickets for expired tags. The tickets are now being issued again. Use the Fix It Cincinnati App to report cars.	None

5. Treasurer's Report	Vince Accorinti reported on the August 2021 Treasurer's Report that had been posted online prior to the meeting (see attached Report). Income for the month was \$6468 from parking lot revenues. Expenses were \$9153, \$5000 of which was beautification and the remainder parking lot expenses. There was a \$2685 deficit for the month. Cash balance on hand is \$56,405.	None
6. Events Committee Report.	Christine Johnson reported. (1) Candidates Night, which is usually held annually with the Walnut Hills Area Council, has been cancelled due to COVID numbers. There is information on all the candidates for mayor, City Council and Cincinnati School Board, as well as information on 2 levies and Issue 3, on the EWHA website. (2) As a result of partnering with Evanston Community Council on the Evanston Fest, a new partnership has come about. The two councils will be working with the Cincinnati Symphony to bring a concert to the communities. The event will take place in the summer of 2022 in Owls Nest Park. (3) The Monthly Trash Walk on October 9 will start at the Evanston Rec Center at 9:00 a.m.	None
7. Parking Committee Report	Rick Boydston reported. The Madison lot lease with the City is up for renewal in December. He and the Parking Committee are working on terms for the renewal. There is paid parking in both the Madison and Woodburn lots, managed by Star Parking. Monthly 24/7 parking is also available via permits. There are currently 40 monthly permit holders. Ticket revenues for violations are down.	None
8. Development Committee Report	Drew Gores reported. She recognized Samantha Reeves from the Walnut Hills Redevelopment Foundation, owner of the Rainbow Building. Samantha reported that the renovation of the 4 th bay of the Rainbow Building is nearing completion for occupancy by Hello Honey. The renovation is projected to be completed in October. Drew reported the following information (1) March First, owner of Woodburn Brewing, has received approval for its application to install an outdoor beer garden in the green space at the corner of Clayton and Moorman. 	There will be 3 permanent structures, one of which is a music stage. Live music is permitted 11 a.m. – 10 p.m. M-Th and 11 a.m midnight F-Sun Amplified music is permitted only on F-Sun. (3) Schulhoff has requested that the Historic Conservation Board issue a demolition order for an interior building at 1709 Woodburn. The building can't be seen from the street and is in bad shape. The 1709 Woodburn property is a non-contributing building in The Woodburn NBD Historic District. That's why the Historic Conservation Board will make the decision. Drew further reported on what is going on in the business district: (1) Suzie Wong's has closed and the space is available for lease;(2) Symposium, a cafe by day and a wine bar by night will be opening in the former Cafe de Sales space; (3) O Pie O has closed but the owners of that business are planning to open another retail food concept later this year in the same space; (4) WoW will take place October 8. She also reported that the Evanston Community Council is seeking a local landmark designation for the former St. Marks Church on Montgomery Rd. The EWHA Board has sent a letter of support for the designation. Drew also agreed to reach out to Stephen Dronen for an update on


