Welcome	President Tony Fischer called the Special Meeting to order at 7:10 p.m. The sole order of business at the Special Meeting was to present information about and discuss the preferred option of the EWHA Stakeholder Committee for the proposed two-way street conversion of William Howard Taft Rd. (from Woodburn Ave. to Victory Pkwy), East McMillan St. (from Victory Pkwy to Woodburn Ave) and Woodburn Ave (From E. McMillan St to Wm. H Taft Rd). A copy of the notice of the meeting sent to the Assembly members and the greater community is attached.	None
Presentation by Rae Vuic, Chair Development Committee	Rae Vuic reported on the history over the years of community discussions regarding the possibility of two-way conversion. She also reported on the makeup of the current EWHA Stakeholder Committee organized to discuss the possibility of the two-way conversion. She discussed the robust process that the Stakeholder Committee engaged in during nine Stakeholder Committee meetings which took place over 15 months, ending in June of 2018 when the Committee voted on its preferred option. She gave a visual projected presentation where she discussed issues related to the existing infrastructure, the four options considered by the Stakeholder Committee and the two-way option that the Stakeholder Committee voted to support. Marc Von Allmen from Dept of Economic & Community Development (DCED)	Marc Von Allmen from DCED reported that DCED supports the conversion of the streets from one-way to two-way as proposed in the preferred Stakeholder Committee approved option. He told Assembly attendees that two-way conversion would slow down traffic in the core business district and by doing so would make the area welcome to drivers, pedestrians, bicyclists and residents who live in the area. The proposed conversion also would ensure that the neighborhood is walkable. He stated that this then increases use of the area, encouraging people to linger, shop and use the services provided by the businesses.	None
Martha Kelly from the Dept of Transportation & Engineering (DOTE)	Martha Kelly also shared the history of the discussion about the two-way conversion. She stated that the two-way conversion of streets in Walnut Hills was simpler because of the straight streets in WH and no addition of new traffic signals. While referring to maps of the proposed two-way conversion plan projected for attendees to see, Ms. Kelly discussed the specifics of the proposed two-way conversion plan and told the attendees that DOTE supports the two-way conversion. She discussed installation of new traffic lights, retrofitting existing traffic lights to work two ways, the removal of a traffic island at McMillan and Woodburn and the reduction of the size of the traffic island at WH Taft and Woodburn. She discussed the introduction of a center left turn lane on Taft and when parking would be available and where on the streets impacted by the two-way conversion. She stated that the traffic light at Taft and Woodburn doesn't work well now and the intersection will remain challenging after the two-way conversion. She discussed the positive impact on St Ursula school safety (pedestrian safety) by reducing the speed of vehicles on McMillan. She also discussed the issues and impacts related to current and	None

A special meeting to present the Preferred Option of the Stakeholder Committee 2-Way Conversion Plan has been scheduled for January 9, 2019 and it will be open to the public. There will be no assembly meeting on January 2, 2019.

The purpose of this special meeting will be to present information and invite commentary on the conversion of William Howard Taft Road (from Woodburn Ave. to Victory Parkway); East McMillan Street (from Victory Parkway to Woodburn Ave.) and Woodburn Avenue (from E. McMillan St. to Wm. Howard Taft Rd.) from 1-Way streets to 2-Way streets.

This 2-Way Conversion Plan is the product of the Stakeholder Committee, which has been working with the City administration on this plan for 18 months. The Stakeholder Committee is comprised of residents, businesses, and property owners whose properties are immediately adjacent to the affected area. City officials from the Department of City Planning, the Department of Community & Economic Development, and the Department of Transportation & Engineering will be present to discuss the proposal and take questions. Public discussion and comment will follow.

On January 10, 2019, the President, Vice-President, Secretary and a fourth Board member of the East Walnut Hills Assembly (EWHA) counted and certified the vote taken at the January 9, 2019 Assembly meeting on the two-way conversion proposal. The language put forth for a vote was: "I support the 2-way street conversion plan for Taft, E. McMillan and Woodburn in East Walnut Hills."

The results of the vote taken are:

EWHA Members voting: 82 "Yes" votes and 10 "No" votes Non-EWHA Members voting: 33 "Yes" votes and 7 "No" votes

Total "Yes" votes: 115
Total "No" votes: 17

The City's Comment Period on the two-way proposal is open until January 25. Once the Comment Period closes, the City departments will review the comments and will refine the two-way proposal based on input from the community. This City review process may take up to a month. The EWHA Board will continue to update the community on this process.
