Welcome	President Tony Fischer called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m.	None
1. Acceptance February 2019 Minutes	The February 6, 2019 Minutes were posted to the EWHAs website at <a href="http://eastwalnuthills.org">eastwalnuthills.org</a> prior to the meeting. Upon motion and second, the Minutes were approved as posted.	Unanimous Vote
2. Cincinnati Police Report	Officer Shawn Tarvin, in the absence of Officer Locke, reviewed the crime statistics for February 2019 (copy attached). Captain Aaron Jones reported on the resource meeting of community council presidents in District 2 where a review of 2018 and plans for 2019 law enforcement were presented and discussed. There was a 30% reduction in property crime and violent crime throughout the city in 2018, also reflected in the crime statistics in EWH. In 2019, there is a renewed focus on traffic enforcement and pedestrian safety. Captain Jones requested that the EWHAs identify three areas in the community where people are speeding and creating dangerous situations. These three locations will be subject to heightened enforcement. Captain Jones led a long discussion on the issue of drug dealing. He reminded attendees that information provided by the public is very important and should be reported to District 2 via phone: (513) 765-1212.	None
3. Cincinnati Recreation Report	Vanessa Henderson from the Bush Recreation Center reported that the spring programs start March 1, 2019. There will be mini camps during CPS spring break in late March. The Recreation Commission is looking for lifeguards and summer programmers and is holding a job fair to recruit. She directed people to the website for further information.	None

5. Walnut Hills Library Renovation	Kendall Kidder-Goshorn, the Walnut Hills Library branch manager, discussed the renovation and re-envisioning of the Walnut Hills Library. There will be a number of meetings held for the public to supply input on what they want the renovated facility to provide. The first meeting will take place March 18. All are welcome.	None
6. Damage to CMHA Property and Public Right-of-Way	Drew Gores reported on the status of damage to the CMHA property caused by the scaffolding falling off of the north facade of the former Woodburn Laundry property where the fountain and gazebo are. She reported that Urban Sites, owner of the Woodburn Laundry, is aware of the damage done to four lampposts, a bench and the gazebo and that contractors involved are determining whose insurance must pay for repairs. Urban Forestry will replace the Frontier elm street tree by the end of June. The broken street-side lamppost has been reported to the City.	Unanimous Vote
7. Infrastructure Committee Report	Jeremy Lindy, chair of the Infrastructure Committee, reported on what the Committee does to improve quality of life in EWH. The Committee is focusing currently on traffic flow and pedestrian safety. The Committee meets on the second Thursday of the month at 10:00 a.m. at Manifest Gallery and people are encouraged to attend.	None

Wimburg Landscaping has been contracted to maintain the traffic island at Taft and Woodburn. The Park Board has agreed to do the clean up at the Victory Pkwy traffic island. (2) April 15-19 is the City's neighborhood clean up blitz in EWH. There will be a dumpster placed in the lot north of Gilligan Funeral Home on Woodburn Ave. Tires to be recycled may be placed next to the dumpster. More information about the blitz may be found on the EWH website. (3) Household hazardous products may be dropped off at the City's Spring Grove Ave. site, across from Winton Rd., from 1-7 p.m. on Thursdays, March through October. (4) The trash/litter in the empty lot on Kemper Lane has been reported to the City.	None
